IT'S EASY TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN A NEIGHBORHOOD

- 1. Form a Neighborhood Watch group
- 2. Improve the appearance of your property
- 3. Meet the youth who live on your block and greet them by name
- 4. Make a list of phone numbers of every neighbor on your block
- 5. Make a list of landlords in your area
- 6. Turn your porch light on
- 7. Walk around the block
- 8. Drive slowly on neighborhood streets
- 9. Pick up the litter near your home even if you didn't put it there
- 10. Stay in your community for stability
- 11. Help your neighborhood association or similar groups
- 12. Take away the opportunity for crime
- 13. Report crimes, nuisances and other non-criminal problems promptly

- Get to know your neighbors
- Identify Neighborhood Watch areas via signage
- Form welcoming committee for new neighbors
- Organize regular meetings

Neighborhood Enhancement Program

Chronic Nuisance Property Ordinance

The general provisions of the "chronic nuisance property" ordinance include:

- Hold property owners responsible for chronic nuisance activity on their property.
- Specifying defined criminal activities and time frames necessary to trigger an action under the CNP ordinance
- A review process to insure that complaints are valid
- Notification to property owners that problems exist and opportunity to correct with no further action on city's part.
- Graduated penalty process ranging from monetary fines to property abatement for property owners that do not correct nuisance problems on their property.

Landlord Notification Program

Inform landlords in your neighborhood about this program so they can stay informed about police activity occurring on their rental properties.

Landlords receive timely emails (free of charge) whenever a police incident occurs on their properties.
